

How To Utilize Stone In Your Garden



Natural stone will transform your garden into an attractive, tranquil oasis to relax in on a beautiful summer day.

This garden features natural dry stone walling, decorative aggregates and a mill stone display.

Stone is very versatile and has many different uses.



A rockery comprising of random sized stones together with an abundance of colourful flowers will transform any landscaped area into a beautiful decorative feature.



The sound of running water adds a calming ambience to any surrounding.

A stone water feature could be the main focal point in a garden or alternatively could be tucked away in a quiet corner providing a gentle backdrop for relaxation after a hard day at work. When stone is wet the natural colours are enhanced.

The shelves on this water feature are scalloped to allow water to gently cascade into the trough below. The trough is enhanced by feature lighting, this lighting together with the sound of running water would make a relaxing atmosphere in any garden.



There are many different water features.

This monolith water feature can be made in any size depending whether your garden is large or small.

Monolith water features can be surrounded by lots of smaller stones, cobbles, pebbles or decorative aggregates to make an eye catching feature and again the sound of gently cascading water transforms any garden into a tranquil retreat.



Stone has been used around the perimeter of these ponds in different ways, one is various sized stones placed randomly to add a natural look, whilst the other is diamond sawn regular sized paving blocks which add a straight consistent look. The paving has also been extended across the pond in a stepping stone type manner which adds character. Stepping stones can also be made using random stones.



We have shown here just a few examples of how stone can be used in the garden. Stone can also be used to create driveways, walls, paths, patios and barbeques, the possibilities are endless.
